

SELF GUIDED RIDE SUGGESTIONS

6 Flags over Texas 20 Miles - 30 Min
Texas Ranger Baseball and Jerry Jones AT&T Center

Getting there: Get on Highway 121 headed south
In a short distance you will see an exit for Hwy 360 South
Take the 360 south ramp headed to Arlington
About 15 miles from the convention center
Take the exit marked To I-30, Ave H / Lamar Blvd & 6 Flags Dr
Stay on the Access road and take a right on Six Flags Rd
Turn into 6 Flags for a great time

Or continue to Randal Mill Rd. Turn right (West)
Continue to either Ranger Baseball stadium or
The Jerry Jones AT&T Stadium.

Six Flags Over Texas is a 212-acre theme park located in Arlington, Texas, east of Fort Worth and about 15 miles west of Dallas. It was the first Six Flags Theme Park. The park opened on August 5, 1961, following just a year of construction and an initial investment of US\$10 million by real estate developer Angus G. Wynne, Jr. The park is managed by the Six Flags Entertainment Corp., which also owns 53.1% interest of the Texas Limited Partnership that owns the park. A similar arrangement exists with the partnership that owns Six Flags Over Georgia. Six Flags Over Texas Fund, Ltd, a private-equity, and asset management firm headed by Dallas businessman Jack Knox, purchased the park in 1969. Over the years the various companies that managed the park, exercised options to purchase interest in the fund. Six Flags Entertainment has an option to purchase the remaining 46.9% in 2028. Starting in 1991, the park was managed by Time Warner Entertainment. In 1998, Time Warner sold its interests in the Six Flags parks to Premier Parks of Oklahoma City, which later changed its name to Six Flags Theme Parks, Inc.
